


Spirituality Strategy 1




Sustainability Proposed Enactment

We commit to embrace the *Laudato Si'* Action Platform as an essential focus of the Congregation for the next six years.




Sustainability Strategy 1

Women Strategy 2






Dominican Life Strategy 2
